Phil 399: International Studies in Philosophy Buddhist Philosophy in India

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COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course will be offered during the 2015 Intersession in India study abroad program. It will consist of classroom instruction at the University of Pune, as well as extended excursions to Indian national parks, urban areas, historic archaeological sites and other places of interest.

Buddhism is a philosophy and a world religion that originated on the Indian subcontinent and spread all over Asia and beyond. In this course you will study some of the fundamental teachings of the historical Buddha as well as later Buddhist Philosophers of what is called the "classical period" of Indian Buddhism. In addition, you will have an opportunity to practice Buddhist meditation. Some emphasis will be placed on the role of Buddhism as a means to achieve social change. While most Buddhist texts are written in Pali and Sanskrit, you will be studying the material in English translations. Students may receive credit for both PHIL 323 and this course. This course meets the General Education requirement for groups IIIA or IIIC.

AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

By the end of the course students should have a good understanding of the theoretical and practical aspects of Buddhist philosophy and they should be able to use rudimentary Hindi. Most importantly, this course provides students with the opportunity to study an aspect of Indian culture in its original context. As such, it forms part of the drive for a multicultural education.

REQUIREMENTS

- 1) Hindi language test (20% of the final grade).
- 2) *Final presentation (70% of the final grade)*. Topics will be assigned in class.
- 3) Attendance and participation (10% of the final grade). All students will be expected to attend all class meetings and excursions. If you must miss any scheduled class meeting or excursion, you must get approval from the instructor ahead of time. Failure to do so will result in a reduction in your participation grade.

WRITING ACROSS THE CURRICULUM

This course supports the writing across the curriculum goals of Salisbury University. All written work will be evaluated both on its content and the quality of writing.
